

Covid Testing Options

- Antigen Rapid Testing is available during business hours at Third Coast Family Practice for patients with or without symptoms. Testing is done outside; please call ahead.
- PCR Testing (required for travel clearance) for symptomatic patients:
 - Both Spectrum Health and Mercy require this be scheduled through your primary care provider or MyChart.
- PCR Testing for patients with or without symptoms: can be scheduled online for Meijer or Walgreens and done at your choice of location.

IF YOU TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19, PLEASE CONSIDER MONOCLONAL ANTIBODY TREATMENT:

Spectrum Health Monoclonal Antibody Treatment

- Infusion sites in East Grand Rapids, mobile infusion units, and various other sites
- Persons testing positive and with at least 1 symptom or risk factor are eligible;
- Treatment must begin within 5-10 days of symptom onset;

 - Then leave a voice message with the following information:
 - The spelling of your first and last name;
 - Date of birth;
 - Date your symptoms started and/or date of your positive Covid test;
 - Phone number
 - Email address; or report you do not have an email address
 - You will receive an email with a link to a screening survey. Complete the survey and upload your positive covid test result. Once you have returned the requested information, you will receive a phone call to schedule your infusion. DEMAND FOR THIS TREATMENT IS HIGH AND EMAIL IS THE FASTEST WAY TO ACCESS THIS TREATMENT.
 - If you do not have an email, you must wait for the infusion clinic to call you back. Do not leave multiple messages.
